**CITY LEAF BLOWING BAN IN PLACE**



If Stonegate residents notice that landscaping debris isn't being blown away as usual, there is a good reason why.

The City of Ventura instituted a leaf blower ban soon after the start of the Thomas Fire. The ban is in response to a health issue generated as a result of the fire. The following City Council notification states in part:

“In following up with the County Public Health office, it was confirmed that the local public health emergency should stay in effect during the clean-up process because of the ash and soot from the fire. For the City, this is key because the end of the local Public Health emergency is one of the potential triggers for terminating the leaf blower ban.”

The ban is reviewed every 21 days by officials.



**WATER LINE PROJECT ANALYSIS MOVING ALONG**

There are a great many pieces to the water line project being proposed in Stonegate. At this time, the construction manager, Alfie has solicited and received proposals for the water lines and the street repaving projects, along with an analysis of same. Additionally, Alfie presented an option to just add more gate valves so that when water has to be shut-off, fewer residents are affected. This is not a fix for leaking pipes; they will still leak. The Board is considering all options at this time.

**CHANGES ARE COMING TO THE 805 AREA CODE**

To accommodate the growing need for telephone numbers in CA, the new 820 area code will be added to the area served by the 805. This is known as an area code overlay. An overlay does not require customers to change their existing area code but does required customers to dial “1” followed by the areas code and the 7-digit phone number for all local calls, including calls within the same area code.



**Who will be affected?** Everyone with an 805 area code is affected.

**When will the dialing change begin?** Voluntary compliance started Dec. 1, 2017. Mandatory compliance begins June 2, 2018.

**What will remain the same?** Your telephone number, including current area code, will not change. Coverage area, the price of a call and other rates and services will not change. What is currently a local call will remain a local call. Customers can still dial just three digits to reach 911, as well as 211.
